I am pleased to announce the Retiree Council #13 Professional Grant Recipients. There were 4 Grants awarded in the amount of \$500 for each recipient. Their Grant Applications were well done and followed the criterion set forth by the Professional Grant Committee. The recipients are as follows:

**Kody Andreas** teaches music in Grades K-5 in the Spackenkill UFSD. Kody applied for the grant to attend a two- week program at Hofstra University on Orff Schulwerk Level 1 Training. This program will be an exciting way for Kody to teach and have his students learn about music.

**Matt Haynes** teaches ELL at the middle and high school levels at Tri-Valley Central School. Matt applied for the grant to purchase Timekettle Earbuds. These Earbuds will have a positive impact on learning & social interactions for ENL students. These Earbuds help interpret any form of verbal communication.

**Elyse Joy** is a science teacher at the Orville Todd Middle School in the Spackenkill USFD. She applied for the grant to attend Mindfullness and QI Gong Training. Elyse is noticing more & more students coming into the classroom with stress, anxiety, and frustration. Elyse will be teaching her students QI Gong strategies that will help them in school as well as at home.

**Natalie Sauer** is an elementary visual art teacher at Sullivan West CSD. She applied for the grant to purchase 4 display boards to showcase elementary students' visual artwork. The visual artwork would be set up for community viewing in conjunction with the Spring Musical at the Sullivan West High School. The utilization of these boards will be on going with the community.



### Recap- RC 13 Regional Conference

On October 13<sup>th</sup> our RC #13 Regional Conference was held at the Wiltwyck Golf Club in Kingston. We had a great group of attendees that were engaged and able to interact with speakers throughout the day.

NYSUT 2nd VP Ron Gross discussed the importance of staying active in the union during retirement. He unveiled a new NYSUT Program called The Peer Support Line. This is a new service available through NYSUT Member Benefits at no cost to all NYSUT members & their families. This confidential helpline staffed by trained in-service and retired individuals who understand the unique professional & personal challenges of NYSUT members - can provide answers, referrals, and empathetic support when you need it. Florence McCue, NYSUT At-Large Retiree Director, gave a Retiree Update, which included details of the NYSUT Endorsed Legal Plan through Member Benefits. The cost is only \$55 yearly or \$50 when you use pension deduction. The Plan allows you to have a free: will, power of attorney & Health Care Proxy. She stressed the importance of having our affairs in order making it easier for those after we are gone.

The NYSUT Legacy Award was presented to Janice Scriber for her outstanding leadership over decades of Union Involvement at her Red Hook Local and with RC #13.

Patrick McCarthy also presented AFT Legacy Awards to Paula Ptaszek, and Laurie Silver for their dedicated union service of over 40 years. Mary Lou Davis also received the award but was not present. Her Award will be presented at our next RC #13 meeting.

Sheryl Baker Delano, NYSUT Retiree Services Con-

sultant, made a presentation, "There is Value in Our Union" & outlined programs available through Member Benefits, information on Alzheimer's from NY-SUT's Women's Committee, & Anti-Biased Training through NSYUT's Many Threads One Fabric Initiative. Additional Topics included Retiree access to NY-SUT's ELT Program (Education & Learning Trust), and NSYUT's flagship partnership with Making Strides- Breast Cancer Awareness that has raised 16.2 million dollars over the last twenty years.

The Political Action Update was given by Sheryl Baker Delano and Emiljana Ulaj, our Regional Political Action Organizer. A political action Survival Guide was shared & can be found on the RC #13 website under the political action tab. NYSUT endorses candidates that support our union values, public education and our local communities. Three of those Endorsed Candidates- Pat Ryan (CD 18), Michelle Hinchey (SD41), & Sarahana Shrestha (AD 103) spoke to the attendees, shared their stories/goals and stayed to answer questions.

It was stated by Sheryl Baker Delano that it is imperative that we are educated voters and know that our voice & vote matter. Our participation is important because standing together & playing an active role in the democratic process makes our union, our communities, and our nation stronger!
