now enrolled in Tier 6, a tier that for Tier 6 members. However, has extremely draconian aspects in comparison to the tiers under which most of us retired. NYSUT has made it one of its major goals to address this inequity!

For those of us who retired under Tier 4 we originally were to pay 3% for our entire career. However, through the lobbying effort of our legislative department and the voices of hundreds of thousands of members we were able to get that removed after 10 years of paying into the system. We were able to retire without penalty at age 55 if we had 30 years of service. Tier 6 members must work until age 63 & pay 3% to 6% into the pension system their entire career. Their contributions grow with salary increases. This has created a lesser pension system for newer members and undervalues our valuable profession, which should be reflected in our pensions.


